The Invasion of the Smoke Alarms - Door-to-Door Smoke Alarm Program

The Oregon Office of State Fire Marshal developed a model program to help local fire departments plan and conduct community door-to-door smoke alarm campaigns. It includes recommendations for planning, recruiting community partners, and implementing and evaluating your program.

Goals of the program:

- Install smoke alarms in homes without working smoke alarms and/or are high-risk for fire.
- Educate residents on the importance of maintaining smoke alarms.

Workshops:

The Office of State Fire Marshal is sponsoring workshops on conducting community door to-door smoke alarm campaigns. The two-hour workshops are free and cover implementation of all phases of the OSFM model community door-to-door smoke alarm campaign. Departments attending the workshop receive a free *The Invasion of the Smoke Alarms Door-to-Door Smoke Alarm Campaign* kit (one per department). The kit includes instructions and steps for conducting successful campaigns. When a fire department's door-to-door campaign application is accepted by the OSFM, the department may receive up to 50 free smoke alarms and \$250 for each campaign. This workshop teaches the basic steps to plan a campaign:

- Analyze your fire problem
- Form a community coalition
- Prepare and plan a campaign
- Deliver the program
- Evaluate and celebrate
